



Proposed Amendments to Current Santa Clara Youth Soccer By Laws

I. Amend Section 5.

Remove the following positions:

Field Scheduler
Referee Scheduler
Snack Shack Manager
Fundraising Coordinator
Registrar
Awards Coordinator
Santa Clara Sporting Liaison
Tournament Director

II. Add Section 12: Compensated Non-Board Positions

Registrar: Under the direction of the Vice President shall keep an accurate record of all players registered on all teams, which are part of the League. Comply with all CYSA registration procedures as defined in the CYSA Constitution, By-laws, rules and regulations. Be responsible for the proper administration of the medical insurance program of the League. Act as a liaison between the Organization and the District 2 Registrar.

Referee Scheduler: Shall be responsible for obtaining and assigning referees for all official League games or League sponsored games played within the League boundaries. Shall maintain a database of the qualifications and contact information for all referees that officiate games for the League. Shall ensure equitable and fair distribution of assignments and shall provide a download of assignment and referee data when requested by the Board. The Referee Scheduler shall be required to maintain a minimum Grade 8 USSF license.

Field Scheduler: Shall be responsible for the scheduling of all official League games for all U11 and older teams. Shall coordinate the assignment of practice fields for all teams in order to prevent conflicts between teams

III. Current

Article 1; Section 5. Participation in Organization Events

No applicant shall be allowed to participate in any Santa Clara Youth Soccer League's (SCYSL) activity until officially registered. New players to SCYSL participating in try-outs for Division 1 and 3 teams must complete a United States Youth Soccer Association (USYSA) Membership form (Form 1061) before participating in any tryouts.

Amend to Read:

Article 1; Section 5. Participation in Organization Events

No applicant shall be allowed to participate in any Santa Clara Youth Soccer League's (SCYSL) activity until officially registered. New players to SCYSL participating in try-outs for Division 1 and 3 teams must complete a California Youth Soccer Association, Inc Form #1601 before participating in any tryouts.

IV. Current

ARTICLE 9. AFFILIATED CLUBS

The Organization officially recognizes the Santa Clara Sporting Club as an official club. The Santa Clara Sporting Club will provide an opportunity for boys and girls teams to participate in the competitive, select and premier levels of play. This recognition does not require any team in the Organization to affiliate with the Santa Clara Sporting Club.

Amend to Read:

ARTICLE 9. AFFILIATED CLUBS:

The Organization recognizes Santa Clara Sporting Club ("SCSC"), and Santa Clara United as official clubs. The Santa Clara Sporting Club, and Santa Clara United provides boys and girls within the Organization an opportunity to play Class 1 and Class 3 soccer. SCSC and Santa Clara United will abide by all Organizational rules set forth in the Constitution, By Laws, General Rules and/or any motions passed by the Organization. SCSC and Santa Clara United will collaborate with the Organization to promote the good of the game in Santa Clara and will maintain a transparent relationship with the Organization. This recognition does not require any team in the Organization to affiliate with the Santa Clara Sporting Club or Santa Clara United.

Proposed Amendments to Santa Clara Youth Soccer Constitution

I.Current:

Article IV; Section 1. Constitution and By-Laws. The Organization shall be governed by its Constitution and By-Laws except when superseded by its California Youth Soccer Association Affiliates' Constitution and By-Laws.

Amend to Read:

Article IV; Section 1. Constitution and By-Laws. The Organization shall be governed by its Constitution, By-Laws and General League Rules except when superseded by its California Youth Soccer Association Affiliates' Constitution and By-Laws.

II.Current

Article 5; Section 3. Constitution, By-Laws and Rules and Regulations. All members and players of the Organization shall abide by the Constitution, By-Laws, and Rules and Regulations of the Organization, as set forth by the Board of Directors, and those of our Affiliates when applicable.

Amend to Read:

Article 5; Section 3. Constitution, By-Laws and General League Rules. All members and players of the Organization shall abide by the Constitution, By-Laws, and Rules and Regulations of the Organization, as set forth by the Board of Directors, and those of our Affiliates when applicable.

III.Current

Article VIII (B) Proposed amendments to the Rules and Regulations in order to be considered at the Annual Association General Meeting must be submitted to the President at least 45 days prior to the date of the Annual Association General Meeting. Amendments to the Rules and Regulations may also be proposed by any Board member at any scheduled Board of Director's meeting.

Amend to Read:

Article VIII (B) B. Proposed amendments to the General League Rules in order to be considered at the Annual Association General Meeting must be submitted to the President at least 45 days prior to the date of the Annual Association General Meeting. Amendments to the General League Rules may also be proposed by any Board member at any scheduled Board of Director's meeting.

IV.Remove for Redundancy:

G. Amendments to the Rules and Regulations may be approved by a simple majority vote of the general membership casting votes at the Annual General Meeting or may be approved by simple majority vote of the Board members in attendance at any Board of Director Meeting.
